Tree Committee



The newly formed Abell tree committee is working on both a spring and a fall tree planting. The spring planting will be a volunteer event with free trees from TreeBaltimore. We hope to plant or re-plant ten trees on Abell Avenue at 3002, 3026, 3051, 3112, 3140, 3142, and 3144 (4 sites at the front and side of this location). If you have any thoughts about planting at these sites, would like to help with the planting that will take place in late April or early May (more information will follow), or if you live nearby and are willing to water the trees, please contact Rachael at rvneill@yahoo.com.

The Abell tree committee also hopes to partner with the Greater Remington Improvement Association which is working with Charles Village and Harwood to apply for the next CBT Urban Tree Grant. We plan to identify twenty to thirty additional sites for new trees. This grant will include funding for contractors to expand tree wells as well as plant and maintain the trees for two years. If we are able to get the grant, planting will happen in the fall of 2025.
